To respond to the challenges of 2017-2018, the Board has had to adjust our thinking and make some hard decisions. We've asked more from our management and staff than ever before. But the result of all that effort is undeniable success in shifting our focus back to our core services.

A major concern looking forward is the looming shortage of aged-care workers, especially in regional areas like the Huon Valley & Tasman Peninsula. Averting this potential crisis will require the collaboration of all those involved in the delivery of care – providers, government, and unions.

In response to this skills shortage, Huon Regional Care has partnered with education and training organisations to address this. We now have more students training at our facilities than ever before.

With the challenges facing the entire aged-care sector, the question is — where do we go from here? The Huon Regional Care Board has spent the better part of 2018 reviewing our strategic plan in order to answer that question.

LETTER FROM THE CEO

It is my honour to be writing my fourteenth annual letter to you as CEO of Huon Regional Care.

Sometimes it seems as if these fourteen years have flown by in six minutes, given the fast pace of the world in which we all live and work. Change is the dominant theme of health care, politics, culture and – most certainly – of the aged care sector.

Every year for the past 52 years, since the Huon Districts Eldercare Home Association was formed in 1966, our community organisation has been contributing to the care of older Tasmanians.

From our humble origins that began with Dr OT Kyle's six bed nursing home and seven assisted living units, Huon Regional Care now offers over 140 places for residential aged care, respite care, rural health patients, and sub-acute care. We have three residential aged care facilities: Franklin, Dover, and Nubeena; we employ over 300 staff; and we provide in-home care services to more than 250 people in southern Tasmania (through the Commonwealth Home Support Program and Consumer Directed Care packages).



During this time of unparalleled change, it is vital that we do not become fixated on this moment in time but, rather, take a longer-term view and look much further ahead.

In fact, every year for the past 52 years, Huon Regional Care has been involved in defining the future of aged care in Tasmania.

The challenge of recruiting new members to Auxiliaries in rural and regional areas of Tasmania has increased in recent years and these two Auxiliaries made the difficult but admirable decision to close the doors on what has been an incredible record of decadeslong dedication and service.

We are both grateful for and humbled by the many hours of fundraising work that the EMPHC and Geeveston Auxiliary have undertaken in their determination to improve the lived experience and quality of life of the people we care for here at Huon Regional Care. I would also like to personally thank both these Auxiliaries for their 'swan song' donations – by no means inconsiderable.

The Huonville and Tasman Auxiliaries continue to add value to the quality of life of our residents and we are constantly delighted by the very real and practical contributions they make to the happiness of the residents of Franklin and Nubeena.

All volunteers – both within the Auxiliaries and without – continue to demonstrate daily that their care and concern for older Tasmanians matches our own, and we are proud to be able to call them members of the Huon Regional Care family – working together as we walk alongside the people we care for.

So, thank you to all of you for your willingness to work towards a better future for older Tasmanians in your community.
